  - Collaborative Recognition Efforts: Collaborating with other entities within the council to establish additional awards aimed at recognizing the dedication of volunteers.
  - Facilitating Knowledge Exchange: With representation from all sections in the council EXECOM, efforts are being made to facilitate the transfer of knowledge and experiences among sections, thereby providing better support and guidance.
  - Promoting Global Participation: Encouraging members to actively participate in volunteer roles and pursue higher responsibilities and awards to enhance visibility and member benefits.
  - Pursuing Membership Growth: Setting a target of achieving a minimum 10% increase in membership annually through strategic expansion across all sections.

India Council is focused on establishing a financially sustainable operational model with revenue-generating mechanisms:

- Seeking Funding Opportunities: Through the active engagement of Vice Chairs overseeing different activities, the council encourages volunteers to pursue funding opportunities from R10 and other IEEE entities by submitting proposals.
- Ensuring Financial Stability: The current financial model incorporates incentives provided by Region 10 and the balance of income over expenditure from council-sponsored technical activities. India Council aims to bolster financial stability by increasing the number of sponsored technical events in collaboration with sections.
